## Questions You St. BENEDICT'S May Have



In this section you will find a list of answers to questions that are regularly asked at the start of the school year. Due to the current COVID-19 situation, we may not be able to give you fullinformation at this time. Please bear with us and we will update you with information as soon as possible.

When will my child start school?

Children will start school on the week beginning 11<sup>th</sup> August. We will update you with a confirmed date and time for your child's first day as soon as we have confirmation of this from the local authority. Please continue to check our St Benedict's school App/Twitter for updates and information. You can download the school App from the Scot Ed App by searching for St Benedict's.

 What should I be doing with my child before they start school?

### • Will staff visit my child's nursery?

Fortunately we have already visited most of the children in their nursery setting at the start of our transition period. We have met with nursery staff who have passed on information to us. We will have a chance to meet you and your child at our meet the teacher appointments and you can pass on any further information you think would be useful for us to know.

#### • When will I know my child's class and teacher?

At our meet the teacher sessions on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> and Friday 12<sup>th</sup> June you and your child will have the opportunity to meet you child's teacher. Please check the day and time slot which is in your P1 Transition letter which was posted out to you.

### • Will my child be with a friend? What if my child doesn't know anyone?

We always take friendships into account as well as good working relationships and additional support needs. We have children joining us from a range of different nurseries, so some join us not knowing anyone else. At St Benedict's Primary we ensure that all staff are aware of children who have joined us on their own, so that we can give them a little bit of extra support when settling in and making friends.

• Is there a breakfast club?

The school normally provides a breakfast club from 8:15-8:45. Toast, cereal, fruit juice and milk are offered. The club is monitored by one of our support staff. Please be aware that this service may be impacted when we return in August due to Covid-19 and places will be limited.

### • What are the arrangements for lunchtimes?

Our school provides a lunch service which offers a variety of meals and snacks. Medical diets for children can be provided. Further information can be found here:

Please inform the Headteacher if your child has any dietry requrements.

Children who prefer to bring packed lunches will be accommodated in a suitable area.

All children in P1-4 are entitled to a free school meal.

#### How do I let the school know if my child has medical needs?

Parents should inform the school of any medical requirements relating to their child. If a child requires medication during the school day, parents must complete the appropriate medical form. This is available on request from the school office.

### • Who can I speak to regarding my child's additional support needs?

We have now met and liaised closely with your child's nursery key workers and staff to ensure we have all important information about the children's learning needs. We plan ahead to meet the needs of all learners and that all children are included and supported in their learning. If you have a concern regarding your child's learning and feel they would require additional support in school please phone and speak to our Headteacher, Depute Headteacher or member of our school management team who will be more than happy to discuss and support you with this.
